## In detail:

<b>The makers claim</b>	Tinnitus CBD Gummies “heal and ease various issues of health such as depression, stress, anxiety, mental pain, headache, chronic pain, and etc.” <sup>1</sup>
<b>What is the treatment?</b>	Tinnitus CBD Gummies are chewable gummie sweets, and the makers suggest you take 2-3 per day <sup>1</sup> or the same dose morning and evening <sup>2</sup> .  Gummies contain “mixed natural and herbal ingredients”including hemp extract <sup>1</sup> and boswellia <sup>2</sup> .
<b>What are the downsides of this treatment?</b>	Animal models suggest that cannabinoids may promote the development of tinnitus <sup>3 4</sup> .  Users of marijuana are more likely to experience tinnitus <sup>5</sup> .  Boswellia has been associated with digestive reactions such as nausea, abdominal pain and diarrhoea. Reports suggest it may induce miscarriage <sup>6</sup> .  Cost.  Potential for fraud - the websites we have investigated flag as insecure and unsafe.

<b>Has there been research into this treatment?</b>	There are 10 relevant papers found with keywords tinnitus + cannabinoid in PubMed database
<b>What does the research say?</b>	To date, there have been no systematic studies of the effects of cannabinoids on tinnitus in humans <sup>7</sup> .  It is feasible that different cannabinoids may have different effects on tinnitus <sup>8</sup> .
<b>How high quality is the research?*</b>	A-D
<b>Tinnitus UK's opinion on this treatment:</b>	Very little research has been done, but the evidence so far suggests that cannabinoids may exacerbate tinnitus.  Licences for the use of CBD oil or hemp oil as a medicine have not yet been granted.  "Dietary supplements should not be recommended to treat tinnitus." <sup>9</sup>
<b>Would Tinnitus UK support further studies into this treatment?</b>	Yes, if a high quality study.
<b>Comments</b>	Products containing CBD oil are legal in the UK, providing the content of a psychoactive component of cannabis (THC, tetrahydrocannabinol) is 0.2% or below.
