The makers claim	Charles Stanley CBD Gummies address “the root cause of chronic conditions and allows you to have a lifestyle without pain and chronic disorders.” ¹
What is the treatment?	Charles Stanley CBD Gummies are chewable gummie sweets, one to be taken every morning with water for 2-3 months ¹ . The ingredients of Charles Stanley CBD Gummies are listed as CBD oil, coconut oil and lavender oil ¹ .
What are the downsides of this treatment?	Animal models suggest that cannabinoids may promote the development of tinnitus ^{2 3} . Users of marijuana are more likely to experience tinnitus ⁴ . Excessive consumption of coconut oil may contribute to lipid imbalance, leading to cardiovascular disease ⁵ . Cost
Has there been research into this treatment?	There are 10 relevant papers found with keywords tinnitus + cannabinoid in PubMed database

What does the research say?	<p>To date, there have been no systematic studies of the effects of cannabinoids on tinnitus in humans⁶.</p> <p>It is feasible that different cannabinoids may have different effects on tinnitus⁷.</p> <p>Robust large-scale clinical trials have yet to confirm the benefits of coconut oil⁵.</p>
How high quality is the research?*	A-D
Tinnitus UK's opinion on this treatment:	<p>Very little research has been done, but the evidence so far suggests that cannabinoids may exacerbate tinnitus.</p> <p>Licences for the use of CBD oil or hemp oil as a medicine have not yet been granted.</p> <p>"Dietary supplements should not be recommended to treat tinnitus."⁸</p>
Would Tinnitus UK support further studies into this treatment?	Yes, if a high quality study.
Comments	<p>Products containing CBD oil are legal in the UK, providing the content of a psychoactive component of cannabis (THC, tetrahydrocannabinol) is 0.2% or below.</p> <p>Charles Stanley is a leader of In Touch Ministries. Their website has previously posted a 'scam alert' about these gummies⁹.</p>
