The makers claim	Kara's Orchards CBD Gummies "makes sure that the body functions are improved" ¹
What is the treatment?	<p>Kara's Orchards Gummies are chewable gummie sweets, and it is suggested that one is taken twice daily¹.</p> <p>The ingredients of Kara's Orchards CBD Gummies are listed as CBD oil, Garcinia cambogia and green tea¹.</p>
What are the downsides of this treatment?	<p>Animal models suggest that cannabinoids may promote the development of tinnitus^{2 3}.</p> <p>Users of marijuana are more likely to experience tinnitus⁴.</p> <p>The US Food and Drug Administration considers Garcinia cambogia to be unsafe⁵.</p> <p>Green tea can be harmful in large doses⁶.</p> <p>Cost</p>
Has there been research into this treatment?	There are 10 relevant papers found with keywords tinnitus + cannabinoid in PubMed database.

Tinnitus UK try very hard to make sure our information is right, but this information should not be taken as medical advice. You should always check with your doctor before trying any tinnitus treatment.

What does the research say?	To date, there have been no systematic studies of the effects of cannabinoids on tinnitus in humans ⁷ . It is feasible that different cannabinoids may have different effects on tinnitus ³ .
How high quality is the research?*	A-D
Tinnitus UK's opinion on this treatment:	Very little research has been done, but the evidence so far suggests that cannabinoids may exacerbate tinnitus. Licences for the use of CBD oil or hemp oil as a medicine have not yet been granted. "Dietary supplements should not be recommended to treat tinnitus." ⁸
Would Tinnitus UK support further studies into this treatment?	Yes, if a high quality study.
Comments	Products containing CBD oil are legal in the UK, providing the content of a psychoactive component of cannabis (THC, tetrahydrocannabinol) is 0.2% or below.
